

Dr. Harilaos Mertzanis has a B.A. degree in Economics (honors) from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (Greece) and a PhD in Economics and Finance from New School for Social Research in New York (USA), where he studied as a Fulbright and a NATO fellow. Today, Dr. Mertzanis serves as the Director of Research, Certification and MIS of the Hellenic Capital Market Commission, where he is employed since 1996. In the past, he served as the Director of the Industrial Liaison Office of the University of Thessaly, a special advisor to the Chamber of Commerce in Volos on SME financing, a project analyst in Citibank and a statistical analyst in the NYC Board of Education's research department. Dr. Mertzanis also teaches finance courses at the Greek Open University. In the past, he has taught courses in economics and finance at the La Verne University, the University of Thessaly, the New York University, the New School University and the City University of New York. He has published several articles in foreign and domestic academic journals on macroeconomics, finance, corporate governance, economic philosophy and history and has made numerous presentations in international and domestic academic conferences. He has participated in professional international fora and meetings (EU Commission, EU Council, CESR, OECD, etc.) as either an expert or country representative.
